


The Port of Cleveland spurs job creation and helps our region compete globally by connecting local businesses to world markets through the most cost-effective method of freight transportation in the region.

- 13.45 million tons of cargo

Port of Cleveland Maritime Business









Maritime Business General Cargo Terminal

- Terminal Operator: Logistec, USA
- 400-650,000 MT annually
- 80 acres
- Cargoes
 - Breakbulk
 - Containers
 - Dry bulk
 - Liquid bulk (new in 2023)
 - Heavy machinery
 - Finished/semi-finished steel
 - Project cargo
- 40-50 cruise calls annually





Maritime Business Cleveland Bulk Terminal



- Terminal Operator: Logistec, USA
- 45 acres
- Primarily iron ore, feeder to Cleveland Cliffs
- Automated ship loading and conveyance system
- Up to 6-7 million tons throughput



Environment & Sustainability *Current/Past Initiatives*

- Founding member of Green Marine, active since 2007
- Development of Cleveland Lakefront Nature Preserve
- Repowering/replacement of cargo handling equipment
- LED conversions, dusk to dawn sensors
- Icebreaker wind project support
- Collaboration with Great Lakes Towing to repower tugs
- Main gate improvements resulting in reduced congestion





Environment & Sustainability Ramping Up Efforts


- Why is it important to reduce emissions?

Climate Action Planning The Process


- Comprehensive emissions inventory of mobile and stationary sources
- Review regional stakeholders' and partners' climate action plans
- Determine scope of control and reduction goals and targets
- Develop strategies and actions to accomplish goals
- Implement and monitor






Climate Action Planning Port of Cleveland's Plan


- Net-zero emissions (Scope 1 and 2) by 2050
 - Encourage and incentivize
 Scope 3
- Strong alignment with Capital Improvement Plan and Green Marine Framework
- Partnership with Cleveland Public Power
- Revisit every 5 years

- \$27.2M FY 2022 PIDP grant
- Electrification & Net-Zero
 Emissions Master Plan
 - Funding strategies
 - Technology evaluation
 - Renewable energy generation/procurement
 - Rate and tariff analysis
 - Resiliency
- Electrical infrastructure upgrades to be prepared for fleet transition, cold ironing, etc.
